



CBD drive-through offers customers comforting alternative

One-of-a-kind dispensary helps serve customers with chronic pain, anxiety

BRATTLEBORO, Vt. — A unique dispensary in Brattleboro is aiming to help customers suffering from chronic pain or anxiety access to products that help relieve their symptoms.

"We just open the drawer, they send the money through and we send out the product and they're good to go," dispensary manager Jenny O'Connor said.

Ceres, operating in a former bank location, is the only dispensary in Vermont to offer a drive-through option for customers.

O'Connor said customers using CBD products to treat chronic pain or anxiety benefit from the option of staying in their cars, especially during the winter months.

"I use the salve and I use it for rheumatoid arthritis and it is a game changer," longtime customer Lisa Salzbrunn said.

"It's hard to get in and out of your car, especially if you're in a lot of pain. It's just one thing you don't have to do anymore," she said.

O'Connor said oil-based products and edible gummies are some of the more popular products available.

The dispensary has also applied to start offering THC products for medical marijuana patients.

O'Connor said Ceres hopes to be able to offer the new service in the near future.
